Honoring Our Legacy, Building Our Community, Moving Towards Our Future in Christ.



If you're a woman and you're a member of an Episcopal Church -

Well, then, you're automatically a member of Episcopal Church Women! Spanning all ages, ethnic origins and socioeconomic backgrounds — and every variety of theological, liturgical and political view — the common denominator of members is love of God and the wish to do His work.

Episcopal Church Women (ECW) is centered in congregations and empowers women to do Christ's ministry throughout the world. Our vision is to be a vibrant blend of all ages, who come together as a peacemaking, healing part of the Church. We aspire to be a 'Godspark,'

shining and sharing the love of Christ.

We've been working together a long time – since 1871. ECW began as the 'Women's Society and Auxiliary' and we began to publicize our work straight through the national Episcopal Church magazine. We began raising money and putting together boxes for Episcopal missionaries around the world shortly thereafter. In 1875, just a few short years after we began, we put together a total of 331 boxes and raised nearly \$45,000. That's over \$1,000,000 in 2015 currency!

Throughout the years, in all sorts of ways, women have been coming together and working on behalf of the Episcopal Church, through the parishes, diocese, and province. Read on to see what we're up to today.

A look at some national Episcopal Church Women initiatives and programs

Women of Vision: Scripturally-Based Leadership Development A scripturally-based leadership development program, the National ECW Board is offering this program for your local use in a self-service format. The program may be used as you see fit for church groups or secular organizations (from ECW Boards to Vestries to Scout Groups to School classrooms). You can download the various modules of the program right from the <u>national ECW website</u>.

Women to Women: The Women to Women program assists women by granting seed funds for the development and establishment of projects providing sustainable income, life-styles improvement and strengthening communities. We give women the tools they need to empower themselves. A few examples:

- Women's Poultry Farm, Diocese of Lui in Sudan
- Bethlehem Tailor's Training Centre, Diocese of Kajo Keji in Sudan
- Matènwa (small, rural Haitian community) Community Arts Project, Matènwa Learning Center, Cambridge, Massachusetts
- Blanketing Navajoland, Episcopal Church in Navajoland
- Anti-Violence Campaign and Curriculum Translation Services Program, Episcopal Cathedral School, San Juan, Puerto Rico

Many local chapters of Episcopal Church Women, along with dioceses and individuals, spiritually and financially support these projects.

Find out more and become involved

Start by finding out if your parish or church has an ECW chapter. Your rector or vicar should know! From there, you can contact the women in your church who are active in ECW and discover what activities, initiatives, and programs they're currently sponsoring.

If your parish doesn't have an ECW chapter, you might talk with your rector or vicar about how to get one started. And ECW members at your district level will be glad to help you.

In 1871, General Convention authorized the first Women's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions and in 1874 the first ECW Triennial in NY was held. The mission empowers the women of ECW to become a vibrant blend of all ages, coming together as a peacemaking, healing part of the Church - to be a "Godspark" - shining and sharing the love of Christ.

As ECW has evolved here at Grace St. Paul's, we have become a strong supporter of GFS and often combine activities for a mutual benefit. Many of our GFS leaders are now active members of our ECW Chapter. ECW is a parent group for United Thank Offering (UTO) providing grants around the world to help women and children, the Church Periodical Club-sending textbooks to seminarians and providing bibles, books of Common Prayer and hymnals to churches unable to provide for themselves. Miles of Pennies is an ongoing collection that funds a children's book ministry and the Diocesan Altar Guild helps supply altar linens as well as vestments and stoles for new Deacons and Priests.

At Grace-St. Paul's we work to also provide our college students with a Student Service Award each year for their service to church and community. We would love to have you join us.



1. A place we can all call home is where this hunt starts. Where these icons picture resides is not in a room above. Once a room for children to learn, now a place where events can be held. Pull up close to a portrait and take a selfie for your hunter orientation.

2. Called the "Old Ironsides" and "the Tuskegee of the North" this Bordentown place of learning has been closed since 1955. Before the passage of Brown v Board of Education, co-eds with melanated skin could learn vocations from this institution.

3. Burlington's only elementary school for Black students was named after a wellknown businessman and staunch Unionist mayor during the Civil War. Some might have called him Bill but this school used his government name to honor his legacy.

4. Located on this elevated street in a township that shares the same name as the county... that shares the same name as the site. Pick up your prescription here or find your go to over- -the-counter medication.

5. A piece of land surrounded by water, located in the River of the second smallest state. Black presence as early as 1664, making it one of the earliest places in New Jersey where Black enslaved individuals can be documented.

6. This community located along the Rancocas Creek that was once home to freed slaves shares the same name as the famous city in the Republic of Mali. The residents of this community had also defended a freedom seeking Perry Simmons from a slave catcher, and this
