To move forward ensuring all surveys are tabulated and synthesized we will relaunch the surveys on August 13th. Hereto, we're adding a third week to the deadline for surveys to be completed. Following the relaunch, the new survey completion deadline date will be September 3rd.

I'm very sorry for any inconvenience this may have caused you and your parishioners. I'm confident the computer code issues will be resolved soon, and we'll be able to meet the newly established schedule as delineated above. Thank you for your patience.


